## Parent Academy Nights

This year Dodge City Middle School continues the Parent Academy program aimed at helping to strengthen communications and connections between middle school students, their parents and DCMS. The Parent Academy nights have been designed with a variety of topics and activities focused on the important relationships at this critical point in the students' lives. Throughout the year we dedicated different nights to different topics that directly impact the parents and students of DCMS.

Family Learning Events are held in culturally enriching venues to provide educational activities for families with middle level aged children, designed to foster strong relationships between parents and children. "Family-strengthening interventions impact both parenting processes and child outcomes. Successful programs promote parent-child bonding..." (American Educational Research Association, 2007).

Venues for this year will include; Digital Parent Night including Bully Prevention and Internet Safety, "iPad Awareness Nights" for all grade levels, "Love and Logic Presentation", "Fitness and Health Night" and "Silent Epidemic Presentation". Workshops and parent night resource will be built into the event so that families can learn and have fun together at the same time. Next year DCMS will help promote these events by sharing a flier with parents. All Family Learning Event information will be posted on the school DCMS Parent Academy Website as well as featured articles printed in the Cardinal Newsletter.

The Parent Academy was created with the goals to:

- educate parents about the importance of their role in school and home;
- strengthen the family unit;
- unite families and schools; and
- inform parents of their rights, responsibilities and the educational opportunities available to their children and to them personally.

## SKYWARD Family Access


During enrollment, DCMS will provide a help desk for any parent who would like to enroll in the Family Access student reporting system. We will provide support for both online enrollment and apps for mobile devices such as cell phones or tablets.

Family Access by Skyward is a free service designed for families who would like to easily track your student(s) academic progress while at school. The service allows parents or guardians to view your student's attendance, grades, schedule, food service balance, progress, assignments and emergency information. Using Family Access does require an application form with the appropriate information to validate parent and/or guardian that would like to have a login and password assigned to them. Parents and/or guardians of the same student(s) can share the same login and password if that would be easier for them. We also want to remind everyone that this is a free service and you do not have to worry about sending any money at any time.

## iPads for Students and Digital Parent Nights

In January of 2013, all students at DCMS will be issued an iPad for classroom use. To qualify for an iPad parents and students must attend one of the parent night training sessions that will be held in October and November. The purpose of these parent nights is to:

- Establish the importance of following the districts user agreement and proper care of mobile devices
- Understand the standards associated with digital literacy of both teachers and students
- Review the differences between knowledge construction as opposed to content delivery
- Improve access from the classroom to the resources of Learning@DCMS
- Educate DCMS students as to the importance of appropriate and ethical behavior online



During the Digital Parent Nights students and parents will be asked to sign a user agreement ensuring that each student and parent understands the responsibilities associated with having and operating a mobile device on campus. Critical to the effective participation in using a mobile device like an iPad are the digital citizenship skills that are associated with enabling students to protect their reputations, develop their voice, and develop into safe and savvy Internet users. That is why every parent should make an effort to attend one of the three scheduled Digital Parent Nights. Students will not be issued a mobile device unless they have attended one training session and the User Agreement has been signed by both the parent and students. Parents who have more than one student attending Dodge City Middle school may choose one night that best fits their schedule. The digital parent nights have been scheduled for the following dates and times.
