- Developmental Question: <u>The Who:</u> (Who are the students we are trying to educate? (What are their needs, interest and abilities?)
 - 1. Social Creatures,
 - 2. Peer Relationships,
 - 3. Figuring out who they are,
 - 4. Questioning their own beliefs,
 - 5. Many have duties at home,
 - 6. Variance of abilities in all subjects,
 - 7. How to manage sports and school subjects
 - 8. Multicultural Backgrounds
- Curriculum Question: <u>The What:</u> (What do they need to know now and likely need to know in the future)
 - 1. Responsibility
 - 2. Hallway transitioning
 - 3. "School" appropriate behavior
 - 4. Organization
 - 5. Strong work ethic
 - 6. To understand that grades do matter
- Methodology Question: <u>The How:</u> (What Strategies and techniques shall we use to teach the content and skills that meet the student need interest and abilities?)
 - 1. More parent contact/involvement
 - 2. Integrating the iPad more effectively
 - 3. Group/partner work
 - 4. Hands on learning
 - 5. More exploration learning
 - 6. Real world application learning
